THE LIFE OF ELIJAH

"When Fatigue Sets In" 1 Kings 19:1-21

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Today many suffer from Emotional Collapse.
 - a) Meaning life has collapsed
 - b) Followed by Pain and great Depression in our emotional being.
- 2. The **Supernatural Miracle** we need has nothing to do with our circumstances but has to do with staying in our right minds.
- 3. When discouragement lingers on it can turn into depression.
 - a) And depression is discouragement on steroids.
 - b) When discouragement goes unresolved it leads to depression.
 - 1) And when depression goes unresolved it leads to despair.
 - 2) And when you get to despair you have reached a level of hopelessness where you see not exit.
 - c) When discouragement leads to depression that leads to despair, that's when people consider death.
- 4. When we last saw Elijah: 18:44-46
 - a) "And the hand of the LORD was on him"
- 5. Elijah was heroic without question!!
 - a) He was of great humility.
 - b) He was just a man like us.
- 6. When we read our Bibles we find that such feelings were not uncommon among many of those we would consider successful men of God.
 - a) Moses Numbers 11: 13-15
 - b) **Job** Job 3:11
 - c) **Jonah 4:8**
 - d) Paul 2 Corinthians 1:8
- 7. For several years now Elijah stood strong against insurmountable odds!!
 - a) AND NOW??
 - 1) Elijah has fallen into the pit of despair!!

FOUR MAJOR PERSONALITIES

I. AHAB THE KING

- 1. 1 Kings 19:1
- 2. Ahab was dominated by his wife Jezebel!!!
- 3. Ahab fell apart under pressure.
 - a) When that happened he relied on his wife to get him through and to give him the strength that he needed to survive.

II. JEZEBEL THE CONTROLLER

- 1. Ahab also relied on Jezebel to carry out his responsibilities as King.
- 2. 1 Kings 19:2
- 3. Jezebel fits to the T the definition of a domineering wife.
 - a) She used threats, intimidation, and schemes when she saw Ahab crumbling under pressure.

III. ELIJAH THE PROPHET

- 1. Vs 2
- 2. Vs 3-4
 - a) Elijah couldn't have run further.
- 3. Remember the scene in Forest Gump where he ran clean across Alabama and then all the way to the ocean?
- 4. Beersheba was the southern limit of the land.
- 5. QUESTION: So why did Elijah fear Jezebel's threats?

A. ELIJAH WAS NOT THINKING <u>CLEARLY</u>

- 1. Elijah was so shortsighted that he failed to consider the source of this threat.
- 2. This threat came from an unbelieving woman who lived a godless life.

B. <u>SEPARATED</u> HIMSELF FROM OTHER BELIEVERS

1. Vs 3

- 2. Discouraged people are lonely people.
- 3. That courage transfusion would have kept him strong.

C. CAUGHT IN THE UNDERTOW OF A GREAT VICTORY

- 1. We are most vulnerable after a great victory.
- 2. That's why we need to set up our defense against the enemy.

D. ELIJAH WAS EMOTIONALLY AND PHYSICALLY SPENT

- 1. For years Elijah was PUBLIC ENEMY NUMBER ONE.
- 2. On the heels of that he had an unbelievable confrontation with the people of Israel and the prophets of Baal and Asherah!!
 - a) And Elijah was at the end of his rope physically and emotionally.

E. LOST IN SELF-PITY

- 1. Self-pity is a pathetic emotion.
 - a) It will lie to you. It will exaggerate. It will drive you to tears!
 - b) It will cultivate a "victim mentality" in your head
- 2. And it can even bring you to the point of wishing to die, which is where Elijah was.
 - a) "For I am not better than my fathers."
 - 1) Self-pity mauls its way inside our minds like a beast and claws us to shreds.

IV. THE GOD OF MERCY

 - 2) Notice God as he counsels Elijah.

 - a) Vs 11-12a

- b) Wind Earthquake Fire. One right after another
- 4) Elijah is waiting before God. But God was not in any of those disturbances.
 - a) Vs 12b-13
- 5) God drew Elijah out of the cave of self-pity6and discouragement and depression.
 - a) Vs 13b
 - 1) "What are you doing here Elijah?"
- 6) Vs 15-18
- c) God gave Elijah a close personal _____.
 - 1) Vs 19-21
 - 2) God allowed Elijah to pass his mantle to Elisha, his successor.
 - 3) But also a close personal friend.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. When we fall into Discouragement, Depression or Despair it is absolutely essential that we get our eyes back on the Lord.
- 2. **LESSON HERE**: Is that sometimes we are more enamored with the gifts God gives us than the **GIVER HIMSELF**.
- 3. Elijah reminds us to look up!!!
 - a) Let's look up after He delivers us from Discouragement.
 - b) Let's look up after He delivers us from Depression.
 - c) Let's look up after He delivers us from Despair.
 - d) Let's look up after He faithfully provides a companion who understands and encourages us.
