THE UNVEILING OF JESUS CHRIST

"The Suffering Church"
Revelation 2:8-11

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Proverbs 6:16-19
- 2. Vary rarely do Americans experience depravation because of their faith.
- 3. What would happen if we suddenly lost everything on account of our testimony for Christ?
 - a) That would be the church of Smyrna.
- 4. Some pertinent historical background about Smyrna.
 - a) Smyrna was foundered in 1000BC
 - b) It was destroyed in 600 BC
 - c) And rebuilt by Lysimacus one of Alexander the Greats generals.
- 5. The name of the city, Smyrna, means "myrrh" an ordinary perfume. Matthew 2:11
 - a) It was also used in the anointing oil of the tabernacle.
 - a) Exodus 30:22-25
 - b) It was used to deaden the pain- an anesthetic
 - a) Mark 15:23
 - c) And for embalming the dead.
 - a) John 19:39
- 6. Now watch this Isaiah 60:6 WOW
- 7. **NOW WATCH THIS**: It was a matter of pride to the city that it had DIED AND RISEN to life again.
 - a) And it was considered the most beautiful cities the Greeks ever built.
 - b) Smyrna sat on a hill rising from the sea so that it looked like a crown.
 - c) Smyrna was called "The Glory of Asia" because of its pride and beauty.
- 8. During the Roman period, Ceasar worship in Asia was created in Smyrna.
 - a) The city was a place of wisdom, beauty, and commerce.
 - b) It was also the location of the church of Jesus Christ.

I. THE CHURCH AT SMYRNA

- 1. We don't know much about the founding of the church...
 - a) Vs 8
 - b) However we do know they suffered great persecution for their faith in Christ.

- 2. This letter to Smyrna is the shortest of the seven letters and contains no CONDEMNATION.
 - a) Cf 2:4

II. WHY THEY SUFFERED

A. BECAUSE OF THEIR INSIGNIFICANCE

- 1. There was a street in Smyrna called "The Street of the Gods".
 - a) It was lined with temples to Greek and Roman deities.
 - b) Beautifully ornate structures which competed with each other for attention and acclaim.
- 2. Christians in Smyrna were experiencing the bitterness of suffering, their faithful testimony was like myrrh of sweet perfume to God.

B. BECAUSE of EMPEROR WORSHIP

- 1. The citizens of Rome didn't feel that way!!! Why???
 - a) Because of the Pax Romana = The Peace of Rome.
- 2. The Romans believed in peace through strength.
 - a) The Pax Romana extended throughout the Mediterranean and removed the threat of war and there was relative peace for about 200 years.
 - b) AND the citizens of Rome were grateful.
- 3. Now watch this: This is what we need to understand.
 - a) Emperor worship grew out of a patriotic and grateful attitude on the part of the people for what Rome provided for them.
- 4. **WOW!!!** To fail to worship the emperor was to be an ungrateful and unpatriotic member of the Roman Empire.
 - a) THEREFORE Christians were in constant jeopardy of being bad citizens.
 - 1) They were tortured on the rack image
 - 2) Boiled alive in oil.
 - 3) Burned alive at the stack.
 - 4) Fed in the coliseum to wild beasts.
 - b) All of these were a form of entertainment for the citizens of Rome.

III. CHRIST'S ENCOURAGMENT TO THE CHURCH

A. JESUS KNEW THEIR PRESSURE

- 1. Vs 9
 - a) "I know your tribulation"
 - 1) "tribulation" means pressure (boulder on chest) unrelenting
- 2. The pressure the Christians were under was unrelenting, unnerving, day after day, nonstop pressure of not knowing "If this will be the day".
- 3. We have no idea what it's like to live under that kind of pressure where physical torture might be the end result @ any moment.

B. JESUS KNEW THEIR POVERTY

- 1. Vs 9
 - a) "I know your tribulation and poverty"
- 2. There are two words in the New Testament for poverty.
 - a) "penes" sounds like penny
 - 1) It carries the idea barely getting by.
 - b) "ptocheia" means to be destitute
 - 1) You have nothing!!!!
 - 2) No resources at all.

C. JESUS KNEW THEIR PERSECUTION

- 1. Vs 9
 - a) "and the slander"
 - 1) "slander" accusations based on hear-say, rumors.
- 2. Vs 9
 - a) "of those who say they are Jews and are not"
 - b) "but are of the synagogue of Satan."

IV. JESUS COUNSEL TO THE CHURCH

A. BE FEARLESS

- 1. Vs 10
 - a) "Do not fear what you are about to suffer"
- 2. **WOW!!!** Listen Up!!! What Jesus said was "Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer!!!"
 - a) Not just "Don't be afraid". "Don't be afraid of what you are facing."

- 3. Psalm 23:4
 - a) "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for though art with me."
- 4. Vs 10b
 - a) "Behold the Devil is about to throw some of you into prison"
- 5. Romans 8:18

B. BE FAITHFUL

- 1. Vs 10c
 - a) "be faithful until death"
- 2. Jesus counsel is for us to stay right in the middle of the PREESURE, POVERY AND PERSECUTION....and be faithful.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Vs 10
 - a) "Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life"
- 2. There are FIVE CROWNS THAT WILL BE GIVEN OUT AT THE JUDGMENT SEAT OF CHRIST
 - a) The IMPERISHABLE CROWN 1 Corinthians 9:24-25; 1 Peter 1:4
 - 1) Those who win the victory over self.
 - b) The CROWN OF REJOICING 1 Thessalonians 2:19
 - 1) For those who win souls to Christ.
 - c) The CROWN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS 2 Timothy 4:8
 - 1) Given to those who love the Lord's appearing.
 - d) The CROWN OF GLORY 1 Peter 5:4; John 21:16
 - 1) Given to shepherds who feed the flock.
 - e) The CROWN OF LIFE Revelation 2:10
 - 1) For people who are faithful unto death and resist temptation.
